Paine Art Center and Gardens

<http://www.thepaine.org/> The Paine estate features twenty garden areas for public enjoyment and education. Set against the backdrop of the historic mansion, the gardens showcase perennials, trees, shrubs and wildflowers. Displays of annuals and bulbs change each year. In 2017, the Paine constructed a new elaborate formal garden designed by an award-winning, internationally recognized landscape architect Doug Hoerr of Chicago. The new garden is inspired by the romance of English country estates, while complementing the character of the historic Paine property. We will have a docent-led tour of the garden.



Louis Comfort Tiffany: Treasures from the Driehaus Collection

During the summer of 2018, the Paine will present more than 60 extraordinary objects by Louis Comfort Tiffany, including lamps, windows, jewelry and decorative objects. This

exhibition celebrates the artistry and craftsmanship of the Tiffany artworks from Chicago's distinguished Richard H. Driehaus Collection, highlighting masterworks never before presented in a comprehensive exhibition.






Abler Art Glass Gallery, Kiel. Creating custom glass works since 1976; 2 indoor galleries that feature local artists and artists from around the world and one beautifully landscaped garden gallery with unique garden art. www.ablerartglass.com



Solaris Farms, Reedsville. Set into a century-old farmstead, family-owned nursery and American Hemerocallis Society Display Garden that offers hemerocallis, paeonia, and lillium plants. Nate Bremer, the owner, hybridizes daylilies and peonies. Customers are free to roam the fields to view the daylilies and lilies, which can be dug up, packaged, and tagged to take home. www.solarisfarms.com

West of the Lake Gardens, Manitowoc. Six acres of gardens on Lake Michigan on the estate of John and Ruth West, featuring a rose garden, Japanese, sunken, formal gardens, and more than 900 feet of herbaceous borders with colorful annuals. www.westfoundation.us

Mariner's Trail Gardens. This six-mile paved trail connects Manitowoc and Two Rivers hugs the longest continuous scenic view of Lake Michigan in Wisconsin. It was designed for bicyclists, walkers, joggers, and rollerbladers and includes gardens, sculptures, telescopes, and picnic areas. In 2007, the Flowerbed Program was started, and 45 gardens along the trail are planted and maintained by local residents. www.marinerstrail.net

Aurora Medical Center and Clinic, Two Rivers, Healing Gardens – The gardens were started by a donation to an employee to start a flower garden in honor of her mother and progressed through a Capstone Project by Shirley Scriver in 2004. A garden committee was formed, with fundraisers provided hardscaping and plants for the garden to be enjoyed by patients, caregivers, and the public. <http://www.flickr.com/photos/auroragardens/sets/>

Don & Kris Cisler, Manitowoc. Their garden was on the Manitowoc County garden walk last summer. Don is the gardener at West of the Lake Gardens.

Holy Family Memorial Heritage Garden, Manitowoc. This hillside garden incorporates 4 distinct but connected areas: St. Francis passage, labyrinth retreat, Holy Family Garden that includes a beautiful Italian statue lit at night, and the Censky Haven of Hope. www.hfmhealth.org/heritagegarden

Christopher Farm and Gardens. This is a one-of-a-kind private 50-acre botanical garden that was started in 1997 by Jay Christopher when he bought a Lake Michigan shoreline horse farm. Over the years, his property has grown to over 400 acres devoted to his vision of a sanctuary for plants, trees, and animals. www.christopherfarmandgardens.org

Caan's Floral and Greenhouse. Annuals, perennials, shrubs, trees, garden décor, gifts, landscaping supplies, pots, fountains, etc. can be found here. www.caanfloral.com

Green Bay Botanic Garden, <https://gbbg.org/> is designed to provide interest with display gardens that capture the beauty of northeastern Wisconsin's four distinct seasons.

The Ridges Sanctuary, Baileys Harbor, WI <http://www.ridgessanctuary.org> in 1937 became Wisconsin's first land trust founded to preserve the original 30-acre parcel. The Ridges has grown strategically to ensure the protection of the most biologically diverse ecosystem in Wisconsin.

The Garden Door MG garden, (<http://www.dcmga.org/the-garden-door.html>) has a fairie garden, double kaleidoscope, pond with koi, a children's play area, butterfly garden, wind and sound tunnel, ornamental grasses area with bottle trees, fences, annual and perennial beds.

Karin Overbeck, Sturgeon Bay. My garden has never been about the plants. It is an experiment in recycling, mosaics and happiness. Recently I've reduced the size - more lawn and vegetables. And yes, I do it all myself.

waterfalls, windchime gazebo, 5 pagodas and countless other features large and small – most with an Asian motif.


