MAPLE BLUFF, May 30, 2007, 5:00 PM - dark

<u>Directions to all</u>: Heading north on North Sherman Avenue, turn left on Lakewood Boulevard at the Village of Maple Bluff sign and Lakewood entrance garden.

Lakewood Entrance Gardens, N. Sherman Avenue at Lakewood Boulevard.

Maple Bluff's Lakewood Gardens entrance, designed by Bruce Company landscape architect and village resident Mark Schessler, are planted and maintained by Maple Bluff Master Gardeners Sherri Baldwin, Janet Battista, John Cannon, Bob and Elizabeth Erickson, Donna Schoor, and Barb Tensfeldt, along with landscape architect Bruce Morrow, Jan Cain, Mary Jane Carpenter, Karen Jamison, and Joyce Johnson. They have twice-monthly garden parties in the summer that are B.Y.O.T.—"Bring Your Own Tools"!

John Cannon and John Fritsch, 232 Kensington Drive.

<u>Directions</u>: After turning onto Lakewood Boulevard, Kensington Drive is the first right off Lakewood. Their garden is on the right in the middle of the second block of Kensington between Roxbury Road and Oxford Place. <u>Description</u>: A mixed border of evergreens and deciduous shrubs, herbaceous perennials, and bulbs surrounds an island bed and goldfish pond. Plants of various colors, textures, and structures have been chosen to provide year round interest in the garden of John Cannon and John Fritsch.

Beach Park gardens by Sherri Baldwin, 500 Lakewood Boulevard.

Directions: Continue on Lakewood Boulevard about a half mile. The beach garden in on the left, directly across from the country club. **Description**: Maple Bluff resident Sherri Baldwin, who is an artist for the Lang Companies, designs, plants, and maintains the Maple Bluff Beach Park gardens. The gardens include window boxes and patio containers, along with perennial plantings around the beach house and in traffic-calming garden triangles. Come and experience the stunning color schemes (purple-blue and chartreuse!) this gifted artist creates in a public garden for all to enjoy.

Barb and Bill Tensfeldt, 408 Farwell Drive.

<u>Directions</u>: Continue on Lakewood Boulevard. There is a stop sign at the corner of Lakewood and Farwell Drive. Turn left on Farwell. After a short way on Farwell, the garden is on the right. <u>Description</u>: A relaxing backyard retreat complete with bubbling waterfall, pond, and rocky outcrops is the highlight of this garden. The rocky outcrops have been carried over to the front yard and together they showcase annual, perennial and woody plants with an emphasis on foliage more so than flowers. Container plantings are placed throughout the landscape for added color and variety.

Elizabeth and Bob Erickson, 825 McBride Road.

<u>Directions</u>: At the stop sign at the corner of Lakewood Boulevard and Farwell Drive, stay to the right and continue (north) up Lakewood. Take the first left turn onto New Castle Way. Go three blocks and turn right on McBride Road. The house is immediately on the left at the corner of McBride Road and Magdeline Drive. <u>Description</u>: Elizabeth yearns to view a garden from every window of their home, so their house is surrounded by gardens that feature perennials, conifers, grasses, and water elements. Their spring plantings include hundreds of miniature bulbs, featuring alliums interplanted with kaufmannia and species tulips, along with clumps of narcissus. Their other spring favorites are hellebores, tiarellas, heucherellas, and two "Roy Diblik"-inspired native perennial gardens.

OREGON/EVANSVILLE Wednesday, June 6, 2007, 6:00 PM-dark

Jan Porath, 165 Dale Drive, Oregon.

Directions: Take Hwy 14 south toward Oregon. Take the first Oregon exit (MM). At the 2nd stop light, turn left on Netherwood. Travel 6 blocks and turn right on Dunn Ave. Travel 1 block to Dale Drive. Jan's house is on the corner of Dunn Ave and Dale Dr. **Description**: Jan has a lovely Japanese-inspired shade garden, with Japanese ferns, Jack-in-the-pulpits, native woodland flowers, a dry stream bed, and lots of interesting woody plants. The use of raised beds with row covers, cold frame, and rain barrels complete the propagation area of perennials and vegetables. It is a working garden in a suburban area.

Jean Bawden, 4385 Oak Hill Rd, Oregon.

Directions: Take Hwy 14 south past the Oregon exits. Approximately 1.5 miles past Hwy 138, turn left on Oak Hill Rd. Jean's house is 1/2 mile down on the right. **Description**: Jean's garden contains a woodland garden, a rock garden, a water feature and lots of sunny gardens, including many interesting woodles. The rock garden, peonies and siberian iris should be at their peaks and many woodland flowers may still be blooming. Early June is her "blue period," with lots of soft colors.

Heidi Carvin, 4304 N Cornfield Dr, Evansville **Directions**: Take Hwy 14 south toward Oregon/ Evansville. Just as you are coming into Evansville, turn right on Hwy 59/213. Turn right on Hwy 59 toward Albany. Travel 2 mile and turn left on Michael Drive. Keep following it to the left as it eventually becomes Cornfield Dr. **Description**: When Heidi lived in Fitchburg, she had a premiere hosta shade garden. You'll be amazed at what she has done in only four seasons with her new, large sunny property. Based on a plan by Steve Lesch, rock walls, many trees, shrubs and walkways shape the backbone of the garden. Heidi created a picket fence garden with raised beds inside and a perennial/annual garden around it based on the Hardy Plant tour to Pennsylvania. Hostas are nestled on the north side of the garage and protected by a swoop of Wichita Blue Junipers. A prairie has reduced the lawn mowing by half.





Roy Klehm Shares Stories and Plants from Song Sparrow

The generosity of Song Sparrow nursery was on full display at the March 21 WHPS meeting as owner Roy Klehm donated a peony ('Cheddar Royal') for each member attending and contributed 52 woody plants, ranging from Japanese maples to Bald Cypress to Magnolias which were given away in a drawing at the end of the program.

Roy presented slides of his garden and discussed some of his favorite plants, including: Malus "Satin Cloud"; Magnolia x



'Marillyn'; *Magnolia x* 'Goldfinch'; *Hydrangea arborescens* 'Annabelle'; Horsechestnut; *Clematis* 'Blue Angel' and *C. viticella* 'Betty Corning'; Tiger Eyes sumac.

Of course, peonies are the speciality of Song Sparrow, and Roy suggested that peonies be planted as hedges in place of privet; they come up early and their great foilage lasts beyond the blooming season.

His favorite peony? Tree peony 'Joseph Rock', described in the catalog as "fluffy, fragrant, white single to semi-double accented with rich purple inner flower flares. Vigorous plant habit...rare and highly prized."
